7) Enclosed Bulleting (Vote)

- Additional bulleting board suggested for the lower level so Kindergarten parents have access to see what events and fundraisers are taking place.
- Vote- Parents passed unanimously to add another bulletin board.
- Amanda will Purchase the bulletin board for facilities to install

8) Year End BBQ (Vote)

- Bouncy Castle- Rental of a 3 lane obstacle course was discussed as a form of fun and entertainment for the kids at the BBQ. The cost is \$950 for the inflatable, \$200 delivery/set up fees and insurance, plus tax.
 - Vote- Parents passed unanimously to rent the inflatable obstacle course
- Helms Kitchen/Food Truck (Vote)- Helms kitchen required a \$1000 minimum in sales to attend our event. In the case that we did not meet their minimum sales, PAC would be responsible to cover the difference.
 - Vote- Parents voted down to hire Helms Kitchen
 - Vote- Parents decided that the PAC should sell ice cream, freezies, and cotton candy instead.
- Amanda will secure the inflatable rental. SinAmen Bun Company has already been secured to attend our event.
- Bubble Station (Vote)
 - Vote- Parents passed unanimously to purchase bubble wands and solution for a bubble station.
- Parent have asked for sidewalk chalk for the event, chalk will be purchased.
- Notebooks, pencils, and Bondar stickers will be gifted to our new kindergarten students. Grade 5's will receive a free freezie.
- Sarah K, will loan her giant cooler for PAC to use for the ice cream and freezies.
- Parents requested that PAC have a suggestion box and fundraising tip jar (funds to go towards our new playground slides) at the BBQ. Both will be put out.

9) Cap and Gown for grade 5 grad photos

- Discuss on what sizes to order. Parents decided to order sizes 39, 45, and 48 to provide a variety of sizes for the kids. Melissa will order the cap n gowns.
- Grade 5 Grad photos are scheduled for June 28th through Violet Rose Photography.
- Amanda will create a letter to be sent home for parents, to get an idea of how many grade 5 parents are interested in getting photos
- Photos will be sold at cost (this is not a fundraiser)

10) Munchalunch 2022/2023 User Fees (Vote)

Parents voted to approve the \$336 annual Munchalunch user fee.

11) Playground Update

- Parents discussed playground ideas again, and it seemed unanimous that parents liked the idea of installing a giant custom slide (possibly two slides) on the hill by the zipline.
- Debbie will contact facilities to arrange for them to survey the area.
- Once the area is approved by facilities, PAC can start looking at having a
 (district approved) company come out and provide us with an estimated quote so
 that we can apply for grants and fundraise towards the new playground
 equipment.

12) Teacher year end event

It was decided that PAC will provide dessert jars for the teacher's year end lunch again this year. Melisa will contact "say it with Cake".

13) Floor open to questions, comments, and suggestions

- Munchalunch- it was requested that PAC look into adding Punjabi to munchalunch. Amanda will look into this.
